Age restrictions

Current Nintendo consoles do not ask for the age of the user and there are no settings depending on the age of users.

The default online safety and privacy settings are divided into three age groups: child, teen and adult. Xbox LIVE determines which default safety and privacy settings to use based on the birthdate that was entered when the Xbox LIVE account was created.

Data sharing

Current Nintendo consoles are not designed for sharing personal information between users; in applications allowing sharing of content created by users (for example, the image of the avatar "Mii") the user is clearly notified that a particular content will be shared to enable informed choice whether to share it or not; any communication/sharing functions can be blocked using Parental Controls.

Microsoft Xbox Live accounts do not display personal information of users and all profile information is blocked for users under 13 years of age.

Parental control

Any communication/sharing functions can be blocked using Parental Controls.

Our parental controls allow the parent to control whether or not a child account can access Xbox Live and also allow the setup of online safety and privacy settings which can restrict which games can be played (ratings) and for how long.
